1. Call to Order

With a quorum of the Quarry Commissioners present, Chair Barucky called the regular meeting of the Garden Ridge Quarry Commission to order at 6:00 p.m. on Monday, July 11, 2022, in the City Council Chambers of the Garden Ridge City Hall, 9400 Municipal Parkway, Garden Ridge, Texas, 78266.

2. Roll Call: See above.

3. Pledge of Allegiance: Chair Barucky led the Pledge of Allegiance.

4. Citizen Comment Period: No one signed up to speak.

5. Business Items

The following items are for discussion, consideration, and action.

a) Discussions/Reports/Updates

1. Monthly Hanson Quarry blasting analysis data reported by Vibratech and recent quarry operations, including any unusual blasts that occurred during reported month/s and/or current month.

Nick Rettinger, Vibra-Tech, presented and discussed the May blast analysis. He stated that 19 shots occurred during the month of May and none of the blasts exceeded the limits of Ordinance No. 34. He reported the highest PPV reading of 0.133 occurred on May 11th at the Holly Residence and the highest Air Overpressure of 112 dB occurred on May 5th at the Warden Property Line.

Nick Rettinger, Vibra-Tech, presented and discussed the June blast analysis. He stated that 19 shots occurred during the month of June and none of the blasts exceeded the limits of Ordinance No. 34. He reported the highest PPV reading of 0.183 occurred on June 14th at the Warden Property Line and the highest Air Overpressure of 126 dB occurred on June 29th at the Holly Residence.

2. Review individual citizen blast reports received during reported month/s.

Nick Rettinger, Vibra-Tech, spoke regarding the citizen blast reports received in May through June and answered questions from the Commission.

3. Location, placement, and number of monitors and other matters related to monitoring of blasts, including placement of roving monitor.

The Commission discussed leaving the roving monitor at the Biersner Residence.

4. Items applicable to the Quarry Commission discussed at the June City Council Meeting.

City Administrator Nancy Cain stated there were no items applicable to the Quarry Commission discussed at the June City Council Meeting.

5. Review historical blasting data spreadsheet.

The Commission discussed the historical data spreadsheet prepared by Chair Barucky.

6. Citizen Comment Period: No one wished to speak.


7. Adjournment
