1. Call to Order

With a quorum of the City Water Commission present, Chair Heier called the regular meeting of the Garden Ridge City Water Commission to order at 6:00p.m. on Tuesday, June 25, 2019, in the City Council Chambers of the Garden Ridge City Hall, 9400 Municipal Parkway, Garden Ridge, Texas 78266.

2. Roll Call

3. Pledge of Allegiance

Chair Heier led the Pledge of Allegiance.

4. Citizen Comment Period – limited to 30 minutes total

No one signed up to speak.

5. Business Items

The following items are for discussion, consideration, and/or action.

a) Approvals

i. Minutes for May 28, 2019, Water Commission Regular Meeting.

Motion: A motion was made by Vice-Chair Holloway, seconded by Commissioner Valdez, to approve the Minutes of the May 28, 2019, Water Commission Regular Meeting. The Water Commission voted four (4) for and none (0) opposed. The motion carried unanimously.

b) Recommendations

i. Request for water bill adjustment/credit for 9742 Trophy Oaks Dr. for billing period of March 21, 2019 – April 22, 2019.

1. Review and make a recommendation to City Council regarding the request.

Jacob Parsons, Water Manager, stated the meter was fine and it was a simple irrigation problem.

The Water Commission reviewed the materials submitted by the resident and agreed by consensus to forward the request to City Council.

ii. Request for water bill adjustment/credit for 21375 Gunther Grove for billing period of April 22, 2019 – May 23, 2019.

1. Review and make a recommendation to City Council regarding the request.

Hugh Spires, 21375 Gunther Grove, explained the materials submitted to the Water Commission.

Jacob Parsons, Water Manager, stated the laptop read showed a recurrence of consistent non-usage; therefore, not understanding where a leak could be found. He answered questions from the Water Commissioners as well.

Commissioner Harshbarger explained his concerns with the resident's letter and suggested Mr. Spires narrow down his request before speaking with the City Council.

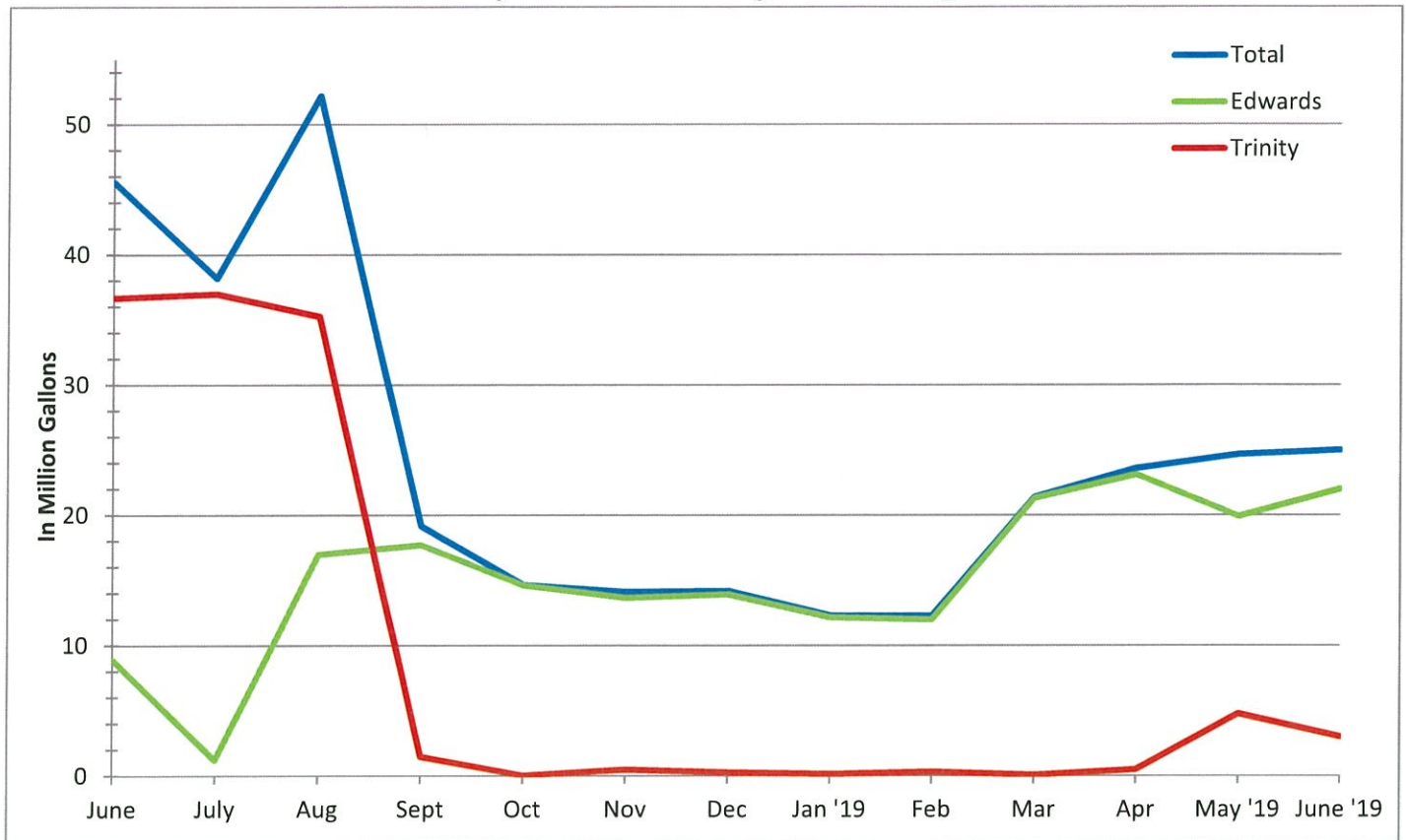

City of Garden Ridge Well Usage

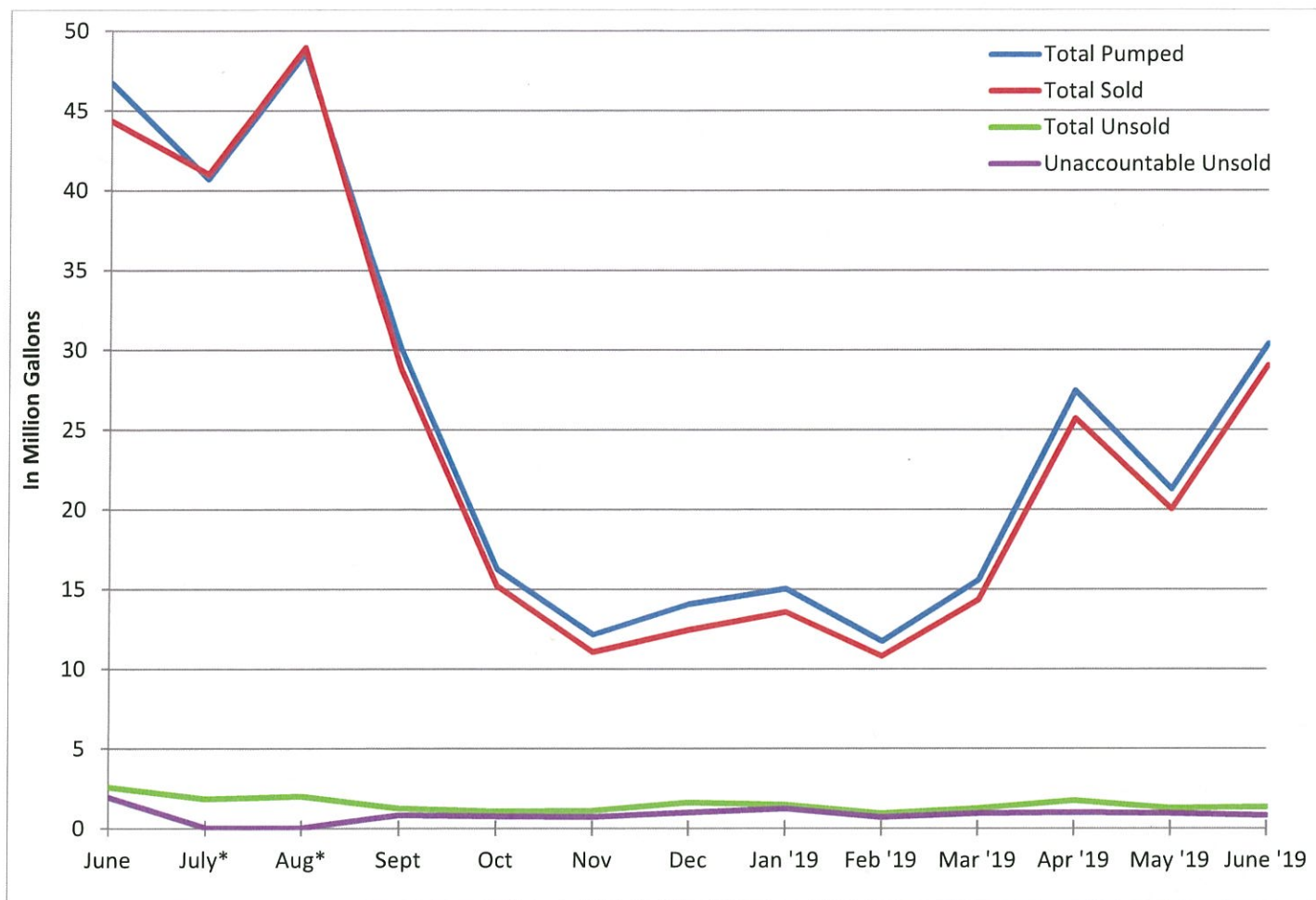

c. Excessive Water Use: Upon request from a water customer, the City may authorize a reduction to a water bill. All requests shall be in writing and shall utilize the form at Appendix F. Customers may request one adjustment per calendar year unless the excessive water use is due to a catastrophic natural or manmade event such as an earthquake, tornado, wildfire or third-party negligence or vandalism etc. In any such event customers should first demonstrate an attempt to recoup monetary damages from insurance companies or liable third parties.

The Water Manager will review each request and research and investigate the circumstances of each claim. If the excessive water use is determined to be the responsibility of the City in part or in full the Water Manager may make the adjustment to the water bill. The Water Manager will report the findings at the next regularly scheduled Water Commission meeting. Partial remedies and claims otherwise determined to have no City liability will be referred to the Water Commission for review and recommendation to City Council.

In all cases Section 4.07 of this Ordinance shall prevail i.e. "No free water shall be allowed to be given by the Water Department to any customer or consumer. Therefore, any reduction to a water bill will be limited to a reduction to the rates at which the water use was charged. Furthermore, the customer shall be responsible for charges for the first 5000 gallons of water consumption as are all customers. Additionally, any usage reduction shall be limited to the actual excessive use period as determined by a review of the monthly water meter log. Any excessive use period spanning more than one billing period shall be considered as a single event unless compelling evidence suggests otherwise. Water bills may be reduced by recalculating the total consumption minus 5000 gallons at the lowest rate.

Adjustment requests for any water bill, for any reason, must be applied for no more than three months from the billing date from the bill in question.
